  because children learn much from observing us.
- Induction: Justifying praise or reprimand by focusing on the consequences of our child's behaviour on someone else's feelings. Through this, we help our child to develop empathy and build social skills.
- Nurturance: Care for and about our child. We should strive to build relationships with our child to
  understand his/her needs and respond when we are needed. Be P.S.L.E. Parents who Show Love and
  Encouragement because a caring home environment is the foundation for building good character.
- Demandingness: Setting and supporting high expectations for our child. We need to have high expectations
  for our child's behaviour and require that he/she live up to these expectations, which should be
  developmentally appropriate and realistic based on our child's abilities.

With Teachers' Day just around the corner, we have reminded your child/ward that a simple handmade card/craft will be enough to show their appreciation to teachers. Please help us to reinforce the message to your child/ward that the best way to thank their teachers is through their enthusiasm and effort in learning, the good character they display and the collaborative spirit they build with their classmates every single day!

We also celebrate EAS (Executive and Administrative Staff) Appreciation Day on the last day of term 3. Please encourage your child/ ward to express their gratitude to our office staff, our school attendants, our librarian, our lab technician, our digital engineers, our security guards and our cleaners for doing their part behind the scenes, to keep the school safe, secured and conducive for learning.

#### I. Administrative Matters

### a. Cyber Wellness Tips

With the growing role of technology in communication, learning and recreation, here are tips on how you can support your child in practising appropriate device usage:

### i. Regular Conversations

Talk to your child about what they feel is an appropriate amount of time to spend on their digital devices per day, given their commitments (e.g., studies, CCA, art class).

### ii. Establish Routines Together

Share your concerns with your child and reach a common understanding on:

- the time they should turn off their devices
- when device usage should be paused, such as during mealtimes and family activities
- when and how often they should take breaks from the screen, or get up to move about
- what they can do online, such as seeking out online entertainment and learning, accessing news and staying connected with peers
- what they should avoid, such as chatting with strangers, sharing personal details (home address, phone number) or sharing of pictures/videos of themselves

Remember, the goal is not to completely restrict your child's online activities, but to help them develop healthy and responsible digital habits that will serve them well as they grow and navigate the digital world.

### b. General Road Safety Tips for Parents and Students

Parents/guardians are encouraged to act as positive role models to ensure that your child/ward remains safe and develops road and traffic awareness.

When crossing the road, parents/guardians should remind your child/ward to:

- always cross the road at pedestrian crossings or traffic lights;
- be alert in looking out for potential safety hazards; and
- refrain from dashing out onto the road suddenly.

With your cooperation and support, everyone will have a safe and pleasant experience when sending your child/ward to school.

### c. Traffic Condition along Alkaff Crescent in the Morning

We continue to notice an increasing number of parents parking along the bend at Alkaff Crescent to drop off their children during arrival times in the morning. We would like to reiterate that stopping at that stretch of road is against LTA regulations and it is dangerous for everyone, especially for your child because it is a blind spot and oncoming cars are travelling at high speed.

There had been feedback from nearby residents of this situation, and they have made LTA aware of this situation. It is likely that LTA will begin enforcement of traffic regulations along Alkaff Crescent soon.

If you are driving your child/ward to school, please use the main gate and drop him/her off at the school foyer for his/her personal safety.

### d. Travel Declaration for September Holidays

To ensure schools continue to be a healthy and safe environment for all, we require parents/guardians to make a travel declaration for your child/ward only if he/she is travelling for the holidays.

To make a travel declaration for your child/ward via Parents' Gateway (PG), go to [SERVICE > DECLARE TRAVELS] within the app.

Please declare your child/ward's travel plan(s), indicating both the country and city of travel, and any city of transit, by 31 August 2023 (the last day of the term). Only one parent is required to make the declaration. If your child/ward is not travelling during the holidays, no action is required.

When planning your travel, please refer to ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart for more information and updates. If there is a change of travel plan(s) after declaration, please submit a new travel declaration via PG or inform the school if the travel plan(s) are cancelled. Thank you for your partnership and support to keep our school safe.

# II. School-Wide Events and Programmes

### a. Children's Day Celebration 2023

This year, we will be celebrating Children's Day on 5 October 2023 (Thursday) and students will be dismissed at 10.30 am on that day. 6 October 2022 (Friday) will be a school holiday.

#### III. Level Events and Programmes

### a. P2 CCA Try-outs

CCAs are integral to the holistic development and experience of the students. The P2 CCA Tryouts is a prelude to the CCA Registration Exercise. The Try-outs will provide our Primary 2 students with a sneak preview of the various CCAs offered in our school through hands-on activities. It will be conducted after school in weeks 4 and 5. More details will be provided at the start of Term 4.

#### b. P4 Museum-based Learning

As part of a refreshed art education syllabus aimed at making learning more authentic and for exposure to local and international artwork and artists, P4 students will have the opportunity to visit the National Gallery Singapore. Together with the gallery's Education Facilitators, our Art Teachers will help students develop an appreciation for the relationship between art and history and acquire critical thinking skills through stories, role playing and group discussions. More details about the learning journey will be provided to the students nearer to the date.

### c. P5 Cohort Learning Journey to Indian Heritage Centre

Cohort learning journeys form one of the key Student Development Experiences (SDE) for primary school students as part of the refreshed Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) curriculum. This cohort learning journey to the Indian Heritage Centre supports students' learning in Social Studies and CCE lessons by deepening their understanding of the heritage and culture of Singapore beyond the classroom context.

The learning experiences will be guided and facilitated by specially-trained museum educators using various artefacts from the heritage centre. More details about the learning journey will be provided to the students nearer to the date.

## d. Primary 5 Camp X<sup>3</sup>

The P5 Outdoor Education Module in Physical Education (PE) curriculum seeks to build character and social-emotional competencies as well as develop leadership skills in our Primary 5 students. All P5 students will embark on the 3-day residential camp experience from 2 November 2023 (Thursday) to 4 November 2023 (Saturday) at MOE Jalan Bahtera Adventure Learning Centre.

During the camp, students will Explore, Experience and Exemplify:

Explore: Students will explore possibilities and overcome challenges, and in the process

develop themselves cognitively, emotionally and physically.

Experience: Students will experience a variety of outdoor learning activities and

collaborative tasks and through them, forge stronger friendships with one

another.

Exemplify: By going through the various challenges and experiences, students will imbibe

and exemplify the school values of Kindness, Integrity, Resilience,

Responsibility and Creativity.

A separate letter with the camp details will be provided in Term 4.

## e. P6 Values-in-Action (VIA) Project

As part of the CCE curriculum, our P6 students will be embarking on a VIA project as part of their post-PSLE activities. The students will be visiting places in the community to carry out their project. This experience will help students exercise ownership of the community and initiate ways to contribute back.
