
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Developmental Stages

Learning and developmental needs of children are different at lower and upper primary








Foundation Stage

Exciting Your Child about School

- Purchase the school uniform and shoes together.
- Choose the school bag and stationery together.
- Label the school books, stationery and personal belongings on the outside, where possible.

Choosing the right bag and carrying it correctly

- Schoolbag should not be heavier than 15% of child's weight.
- Your child should carry his/her schoolbag with a straight back. If he/she leans forward, it is too heavy
- Trolley bags tends to be heavier so they can cause a stress to your child's spine and shoulders
- Pack the schoolbag everyday according to the given timetable.

- Asking for permission and help

Developing Independence

<u>Recommendation</u>: Do not prepare your child on the official textbook-readers.

- Responding when name is called.
- Observing and talking about things.
- Taking turns.



<u>N.B.</u>: Good interpersonal skills do facilitate play and learning.

Learning Mathematics Actively



- Identifying shapes in household objects
- Understanding money when reading price labels
- Emphasising the last number when counting the number of things
- Understanding 'more' and 'less' at the supermarket



Useful Entry Level

- Able to spell and write his/her name in English and Mother Tongue legibly
- Able to recite, recognise and count numbers up to 10 and compare the quantity in two groups of objects within 10
- Able to write the numbers legibly
- Able to identify and recognize colours and simple objects in the classroom
- Able to read simple sentences
- Able to understand simple instructions in English and Mother Tongue
- Able to express their needs and wants

Five Core Parenting Strategies for Promoting Character

- 1. Nurturance: Care for and about the child
- **2. Demandingness:** Setting and Supporting High Expectations for the child
- **3. Modelling:** Being the character you want to see in children
- 4. Induction: Justifying praise or reprimand by focusing on the consequences of the child's behaviour on someone else's feelings
- **5. Democratic Parenting:** Empowering children's voices and autonomy

Supporting your child's learning What parents suggest...

- """ <u>Reinforce the values at home</u>, encourage the child to be an active participant in school activities."
- "Be a <u>role model</u>, have constant engagement with and reminders to children on what needs to be done."
- "<u>Talk to your child</u> at least half an hour a day about school life."
- "<u>Treat school (teachers) as partners</u> in our children's development."
- "Communicate with the teachers at least once a month."
- <u>"…encourage our children to do their homework</u> on time and to revise their school work. Give support when they need help or meet any difficulties on their homework."
- "Be supportive and show interest in school activities"
